## International faculty and key-note speakers



### **Tjasse Bruintjes**

Prof Tjasse Bruintjes is ENT- surgeon with a special focus on vestibular disease in Apeldoorn, The Netherlands. In 2000 he co-founded the Apeldoorn Dizziness Centre, which developed over the years into a centre of expertise for dizzy patients. Since 2020 he is a professor in otorhinolaryngology, in particular Meniere's disease, at Leiden University. His research is focused on the diagnosis and treatment of Meniere's disease,

BPPV and loss of vestibular function. He was chairman of the Dutch multidisciplinary guideline committee "BPPV", "Dizziness in the elderly" and "Meniere's disease".

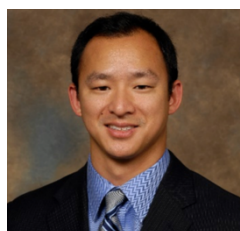


### **Ilse Dapper**

Dr Ilse Dapper is specialist in internal medicine- intensive care specialist – emergency medicine. Leadershipconsultant (Harvard Business School – Ehsal – coachingcertificate)

Founder of BDapper in 2016: the mission of BDapper is to inspire and inform other medical doctors concerning leadership skills. These skills unlock the potential of healthcare workers so they can flourish and keep the good vibes in

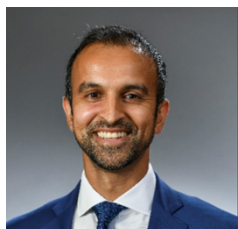
medicine. Since 2021 Ilse is fulltime working as a leadership consultant.



### **Derek Lam**

Derek J. Lam MD, MPH is a Professor in the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at Oregon Health and Science University. He completed his medical school, residency, and Masters of Public Health at the University of Washington in Seattle and a Pediatric Otolaryngology fellowship at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. Dr. Lam is a clinician-scientist and studies the diagnosis and surgical management of pediatric obstructive sleep apnea,

supported by two R61/R33 grants through the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute. His other clinical interests include dysphagia management, airway reconstruction, and surgical management of adult sleep apnea, including upper airway stimulation.



### **Raj Dedhia**

Raj C. Dedhia, MD MSCR is currently Associate Professor and Director of Sleep Surgery & CPAP Alternatives Clinic at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, PA USA. Dr. Dedhia is board-certified in both sleep medicine and otolaryngology. He has a unique background having completed an accredited fellowship in sleep medicine & surgery at the University of Washington, residency in otolaryngology/head & neck surgery at the University of

Pittsburgh Medical Center and a Masters in Clinical Research from the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Dedhia performs the full gamut of sleep surgery including drug-induced sleep endoscopy, complex functional nasal surgery, soft tissue reconstruction, hypoglossal nerve stimulation and skeletal surgery. As Site Director of the Sleep Medicine & Surgery Fellowship at the University of Pennsylvania, he regularly trains sleep otolaryngology fellows.

At present, Dr. Dedhia receives grant support from the National Institutes of Health. His research interests include upper airway pathophysiology in sleep-disordered breathing as well as the cardiovascular effects of sleep-disordered breathing.



### **Navin Mani**

Dr Navin Mani is an ENT Consultant based at Manchester Royal Infirmary. He has an interest in thyroid and parathyroid surgery, head & neck oncology and general ENT conditions. He undertook a sub-speciality training in New York, USA, gaining international experience and expertise.

Dr Navan Mani is the department lead for clinical effectiveness at Manchester Royal Infirmary and works closely with colleagues and other staff to ensure safe and effective patient care.



### **Sarah Lebeer**

Prof. Dr. Ir. Sarah Lebeer is internationally recognized for her research on the microbiome, particularly concerning the vagina, skin, and upper respiratory tract (URT) or ENT region. She earned her Master's in Bioscience Engineering at KU Leuven, followed by a PhD in Bioscience Engineering on the gut microbiome in 2008. Since 2011, she has served as the principal investigator and head of the Laboratory of Applied Microbiology and Biotechnology at the University of

Antwerp, currently appointed as full professor.

Her groundbreaking work on probiotics and lactobacilli has positioned her as a leading figure in the field. For example, she serves as the current vice president of the International Scientific Association on Probiotics and Prebiotics (<https://www.isappscience.org>) .

One of Prof. Lebeer team's notable achievements was their role as the coordinator of the ProCure IWT SBO project (<https://procureproject.be>) , which ran from 2016 to 2020. This project, carried out in close collaboration with ENT specialists Prof. Vanderveken (UAntwerpen) and Prof. Hellings (KU Leuven), focused on advancing research on the URT microbiome in relation to chronic rhinosinusitis and otitis media. The ProCure project laid the groundwork for subsequent groundbreaking studies that have significantly enhanced our understanding of the URT microbiome and potential for ENT probiotics.

Today, Prof. Lebeer and her team continue to explore the role of the URT microbiome in conditions such as otitis media, cleft palate, and cystic fibrosis. This ongoing research involves collaborations with experts like Prof. An Boudewyns, Prof. Topsakal, Prof. Stijn Verhulst, Prof. Irina Spacova, and Prof. Kim Van Hoorenbeeck. Reflecting their commitment to advancing health equity through microbiome-centric and multidisciplinary research, they are launching a new Centre of Excellence at UAntwerp named U-MaMi, dedicated to studying the URT, gut, and vaginal microbiomes.



### **Vincent Couloigner**

Professor. Vincent Couloigner is Head of the Pediatric ENT department in Necker Pediatric Hospital, Assistance Publique – Hôpitaux de Paris, Paris Cité University. He is Secretary General of the French ENT Society and Head of the Scientific Committee of the European Society of Pediatric Otorhinolaryngology (ESPO).

His field of interest and specialization in pediatric ENT are head and neck tumours and malformations, skull base surgery, robotic thyroid surgery, sleep apnea and emergencies.

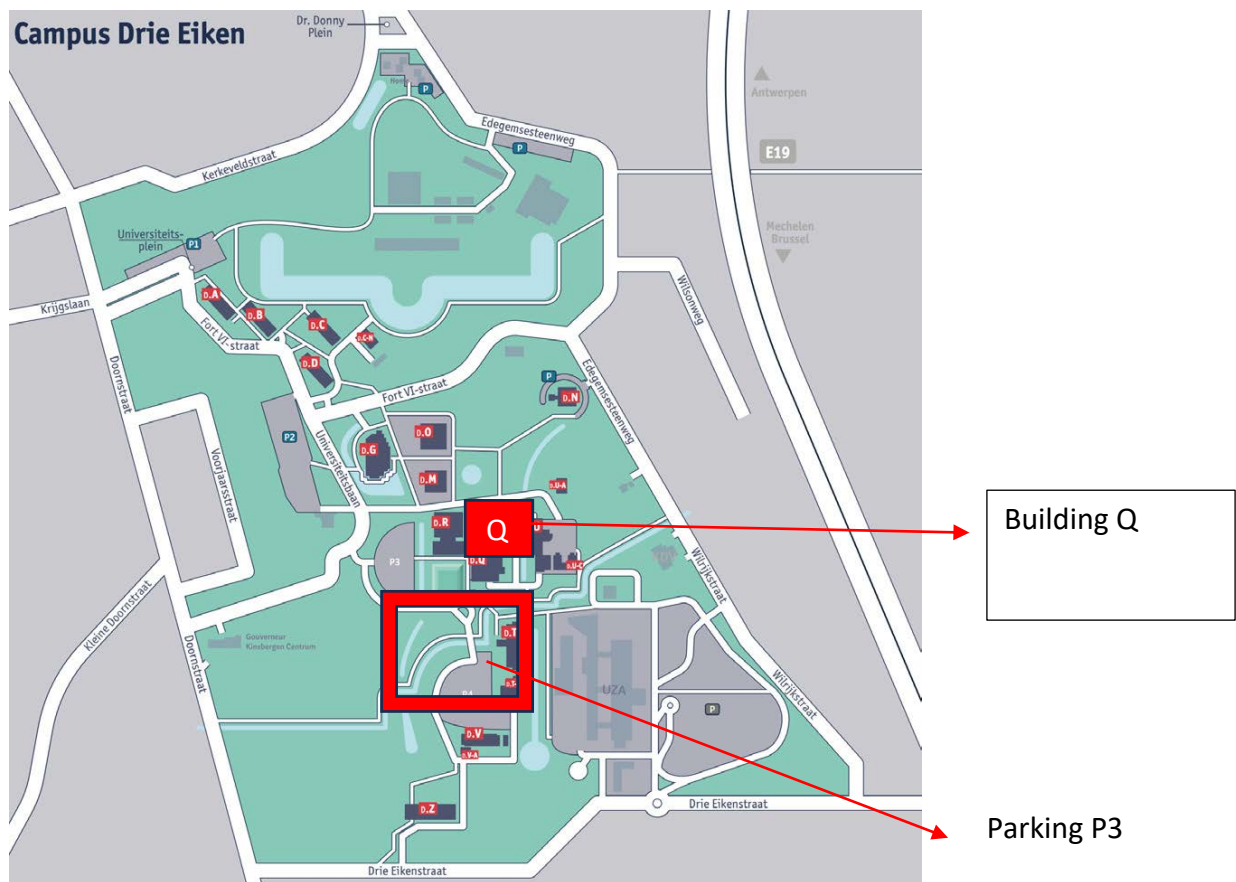
